THE NINETY-NINES, SOUTHEAST SECTION CAROLINAS CHAPTER JEWELL BAILEY BROWN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The Southeast Section Carolinas Chapter Ninety-Nines is offering one \$1500 scholarship to qualifying applicants.

The purpose of the flight training award is to encourage women pilots, promote aviation within the surrounding community and provide networking opportunities for women. The scholarship is awarded to assist women who are working to become licensed pilots or are seeking additional ratings or certificates. The scholarship is open to all women in North and South Carolina including members of the 99s.

SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Applicant must be:
 - a. Female and at least 16 years of age. (If applicant is less than 18, a parent or Guardian signature is required.)
 - b. North Carolina or South Carolina resident or a student of a North Carolina or South Carolina school at the time of the application submission as well as at the time of the final review by the Scholarship Judges (May 2024).
 - c. Pursuing an aviation goal that includes flight training.
- 2. The applicant must possess a current FAA Medical Certificate appropriate for the license or rating sought.
- 3. If the applicant is a student pilot, she must already have her solo endorsement and have successfully completed the FAA Private Pilot Written Exam.
- 4. Applicant must fully complete an application.
- 5. Application and all supporting documents must be postmarked by May 1, 2024.

THE SCHOLARSHIP WINNER MUST:

- 1. Use the money within one year from the date of the scholarship award which will occur on June 1, 2024. Funds cannot be used for reimbursement of previous training.
- 2. Begin training within three months of receiving the scholarship award.
- 3. Provide written progress reports to the Carolinas Chapter Scholarship Chairman every three months.
- 4. Submit copies of logbook pages that show training during the time period covered by the scholarship, receipts showing hours flown and signed by the applicant and flight school, flight instructor or institution providing the training, NOT the scholarship recipient.

5. After completion of the training, provide a letter to the Carolinas Chapter Scholar-Ship Chairman describing training experience and how the money was used to achieve aviation goals.

APPLICATION DEADLINE IS MAY 1, 2024

THE APPLICATION WILL CONSIST OF:

- 1. Two letters of recommendation. One of the letters must be from someone know-ledge able about the applicant's aviation interests and/or accomplishments, such as applicant's flight instructor or mentor. It is important that those individuals recommending the applicant include in their letter the length of time they have known the applicant.
- 2. Written Essay (described on page 5)
- 3. Copy of the applicant's FAA Medical, Pilot Certificate and successful result of the Private Pilot Exam.
- 4. Copy of the last three pages of the applicant's logbook.

The application must be typed or neatly printed in black ink and completed in full. The applicant must submit four (4) copies of the completed application and ALL supplemental information. The application must be postmarked no later than May 1, 2024. An illegible, incomplete or late application will not be considered.

SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT SELECTION:

A selection panel of three independent judges from the aviation community will screen applications and make final selections. Judges must sign a statement that they have no knowledge of the applicants. Decisions of the judges are final. Priority will be given to members of the Carolinas Chapter, then to female family members of the Carolinas Chapter, and then to other females residing in North or South Carolina.

SCHOLARSHIP TIMELINE:

- May 5 The Carolinas Scholarship Committee will review the applications for completeness
- May 5 The Scholarship Chairman will mail the applications to judges.

May 30 Judges will pass their decisions to the Scholarship Chairman.

The Carolinas Chapter Jewell Bailey Brown Memorial Scholarship will be presented at a time and place to be announced.
