SANTA ANA, Nov. 5.—Funeral services for Mrs. Vollie Nora Hart, 52, mother of Sacha (Peggy) Hall, well known Santa Ana aviatrix, who died here Sunday night from a heart attack, will be held tomorrow at 10 a. m. at the Winbigler Mission Funeral Home with the Rev. J. W. Arthur of the Angelus temple of Los Angeles officiating, it was announced today.

Mrs. Hart came here about five months ago with her husband, Charles C. Hart, after seven years' residence elsewhere in California. The husband is engaged in the automobile business.

Surviving Mrs. Hart are her husband, son and daughter, and a grandson, Charles Hart of Santa Ana; a brother, Charles Clark of Lansing, Mich.; two sisters, Mrs. Belle Rogers of Westfield, Ill., and Mrs. Jennie de Moss, Indianapolis.
